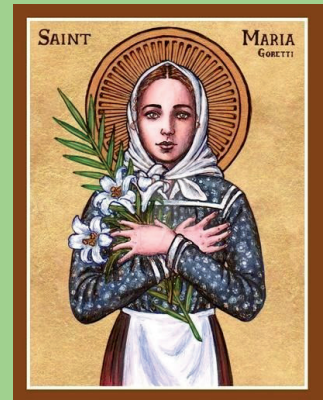

But if you see me at Mass this weekend, then it means that I'm still standing, and hopefully it means that I finished both races! I'll give a recap of the race fundraiser in next week's bulletin. As always, thank you so much to everyone who has supported me and HVM Parish.

Another word of thanks goes out to two members of our Liturgy Committee, Barb Piltaver and Connie Fippinger. They very beautifully decorated the church for the fall season. These decorations will take us through to the end of the liturgical year, because before we know it, the Advent season will be here! But we're not there yet, so let's just enjoy fall!

Even though you likely already know about this, this is the first bulletin article where I've had a chance to comment on the unexpected death of Bishop Kevin Birmingham. Bishop Birmingham was the former episcopal vicar of Vicariate IV (which is our vicariate), and he had served for just one day as the new vicar of Vicariate VI (the south side) before he passed away in his sleep. In his two years as our vicar, he visited HVM Parish several times: he installed me as pastor here, he celebrated a Confirmation Mass with our 8th grade R.E. students, and he blessed Hendle Hall on the 2nd anniversary of HVM Parish.

Bishop Birmingham was truly a wonderful man, priest, and bishop. I was fortunate to first meet him when I was in seminary, and in my years as a seminarian and priest I've never met anyone who did not like and respect him. He really was a man of God, and he had the heart of Jesus the Good Shepherd. Bishop Birmingham's episcopal motto was "Tend My People." That really captures how he approached ministry – he loved to be with and to care for God's People. His passing is a great loss for his family and friends, and for our Archdiocese.

Bishop Birmingham, may the angels lead you into Paradise. Rest in peace.

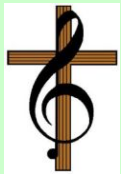

Notes From The Parish Nurse...

Flu shots will be offered in the gathering room at the back of church on Tuesday, October 17, 2023 after the morning Mass from 9:15-10:15am. The standard and high dose flu vaccine will be available.

The CDC recommends the flu vaccine yearly for those 6 months of age and older ("with rare exceptions") and per the CDC, "everyone should receive a flu vaccine that is appropriate for their age and health status." Getting vaccinated helps to reduce flu-related illnesses, doctor visits, missed work and missed school as well as flu-related hospitalizations or deaths. The high dose flu vaccine is recommended for seniors over the age of 65 and is designed to create a stronger immune response for better protection against influenza. For more information check out CDC.gov. The flu vaccine will be provided at no cost to all those on Medicare (Part B); please remember to bring your Medicare card to the flu clinic. The charge for those under age 65 will be \$25, although a waiver may be provided depending on financial need.

If interested, please call the rectory to reserve your vaccine by giving your name and which type of flu vaccine you wish to receive (standard or high dose) in order to make sure that there is enough supply for those who want to receive the vaccine.

I will also be able to bring the flu vaccine to homebound parishioners later that same day on October 17th. For anyone who is homebound and wishes to receive the flu vaccine, please call the rectory to provide your name, address, and phone number, so that I may contact you.
