

# From the Pastor's Desk

We have now entered the most significant week of the entire liturgical year – Holy Week. There are several important and beautiful liturgies that take place this week, so as always, I'd like to invite you to attend as many of them as you can.

It all begins with Palm Sunday this weekend. This is one of the only Masses of the year where we start Mass at the back of church, as we listen to the Gospel story of Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem, and we imitate the crowds in Jerusalem by holding palm branches. Later in the Mass we hear the entire story of Jesus' Passion and Death (this year we listen to Mark's Gospel account).

On Tuesday, March 26, there is no special Mass here at the parish, but there is a special Mass at Holy Name Cathedral that day – the Chrism Mass. At that Mass, the priests of the Chicago Archdiocese renew their ordination promises, and Cardinal Cupich blesses the three sacramental oils to be used in all parishes in the coming year: the Oil of the Sick (for Anointing of the Sick), the Oil of Catechumens (for Baptism), and Chrism Oil (for Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders).

The Sacred Triduum ("three days") begins on Holy Thursday, March 28. Please be aware that, because the Triduum liturgies are the only ones that can be celebrated on those days, there will be <u>no</u> 8:30am morning Mass on Thursday.

On Holy Thursday evening, March 28, we conclude Lent and begin the celebration of the unique Triduum liturgies. At 7:00pm on Thursday is the Mass of the Lord's Supper. At this Mass we witness the Washing of Feet, and we conclude with a Eucharistic procession, and then Eucharistic Adoration. The church will stay open for Adoration until 11:00pm on Thursday night.

The next day, on Good Friday, March 29, we celebrate the Passion & Death of the Lord. This is the only day of the year that Mass is forbidden. We will celebrate the Good Friday service at both 3:00pm and 7:00pm, so you can come to either one (and don't be late – the Good Friday service begins in a very unique way from other liturgies).

Our Easter Basket Blessing will take place on Holy Saturday, March 30 at 11:00am. Please note the 11:00am time, as we used to celebrate it at 12:00pm. Having the blessing earlier will give more time that afternoon to our generous parish volunteers who will decorate the church for Easter. Please also note that there are no confessions heard on Holy Saturday, as the only sacraments that can be celebrated that day are at the Easter Vigil.

The evening of March 30, at 7:30pm, we kick off the 50-day Easter season as we celebrate the highest Mass of the year, the Easter Vigil, also referred to as the mother of all liturgies. And on Easter Sunday, March 31, we celebrate the central mystery of our faith, the Lord's Resurrection. Please note that we will have one additional Mass on Easter Sunday to accommodate the crowds. Masses at Easter will be at 7:30am, 9:30am and 11:30am.

Our full Holy Week schedule is posted in this bulletin, at the exits of church, and on our parish website and Facebook page. I hope that you can join us for the full celebration of Jesus' Paschal mystery by attending as many of the Holy Week and Triduum liturgies as you're able.

Holy Virgin Martyrs, pray for us. May God bless you, and have a Blessed Holy Week.




