From the Pastor's Desk

As we are still celebrating the Easter season (we're not quite halfway through the season yet), I want to begin by thanking everyone who so generously contributed to our parish's Easter collection. We budgeted \$18,000 for Easter, and I'm happy to say that we have received over \$22,000 in donations (and some Easter donations continue to trickle in). I am very grateful to everyone who supports our parish. Thank you!

You could say that this week is the "break week" between sacraments. What I mean is that last week we celebrated the sacrament of Confirmation with our 8th Grade Rel. Ed. students, and starting next Saturday, we will celebrate three consecutive First Holy Communion Masses with our 2nd Grade and Special Sacrament Rel. Ed. students (I'll say more about this next week). So, for this article, I would like to mention a liturgical feast that is celebrated later this week.

Thursday, April 25th is the feast day of St. Mark the Evangelist, who is one of the four Gospel writers. We are also currently in the liturgical year of St. Mark, meaning that we mainly listen to his Gospels on weekend during this year (although not right now, as we always listen to John's Gospel during the Easter season). As you might know, the four Gospel writers (Matthew, Mark, Luke, John) are pictured in the stained glass windows along the back wall of our church. Each Evangelist is pictured with a symbol that is associated with him. For Mark, he is symbolized by a lion.

Why a lion? Well, if you took one of the liturgical art calendars that we offer here at the parish every December, then you might have noticed that the artwork for this month of April is of St. Mark. Here is what the calendar's description says about him:

Saint Mark the Evangelist is often portrayed as Giorgio Vasari depicts him here [on the calendar]: writing his Gospel and either accompanied or represented by a winged lion. One of the several reasons St. Mark is related to a lion is the specific emphasis he gives Christ in his Gospel. Just as a lion is traditionally characterized as the "king of the beasts," Christ in the Gospel of Mark is characterized by his majesty and royal dignity as King of the Universe.

Finally, don't forget about our Mother's Day Spiritual Bouquet. For a suggested donation of \$10 per name, you can add names to the Bouquet, and these names will be printed in the bulletin on Mother's Day weekend, and they will also be printed on a poster that will be put on display at the front of church for all Masses on Mother's Day weekend.

Please remember that these names will <u>not</u> be read at the Masses (those names that are read are Mass intentions, and you can always request those at the rectory). Please also know that, for the Spiritual Bouquet, you can include names of anyone living or deceased, Catholic or non-Catholic. To add your loved ones' names to the list, please visit the table at the back of church at the Masses on either this weekend or next. Because we need time to have the poster printed, the last day to add names is April 28th.

What We're Learning

Kindergarten (Saturdays)

We did a craft project to learn about Easter.

1st Grade (Saturdays)

We talked about how to serve others as Jesus did. The students learned what it means to serve. We read and discussed the Easter story. We learned about making choices and how the choices we make affects others. We also learned about being respectful.

2nd Grade (Saturdays)

We learned how when we go to church the first part of the Mass is called the Liturgy of the Word. There is a reading from the Old Testament, the Psalm is sung, and there is a New Testament reading. The priest reads from the Gospel. During the Mass the priest does a Eucharistic prayer that consecrates the Body and Blood of Christ. We then take Communion.

3rd Grade (Saturdays)

We discussed Pentecost and the Sacraments of Initiation.

5th Grade (Saturdays)

We learned about our call to be missionaries. We learned that even if we don't travel to faraway lands, we are still called to bring the Good News to Jesus to those we encounter in our every day lives. This is called evangelization.

7th Grade (Saturdays)

We learned that the Sacrament of Reconciliation contains 4 important elements: contrition, confession, penance, and absolution. We learned that according to the precepts of the church we must receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation at least once a year.


