

### *From the Pastor's Desk*

When I wrote this article earlier this week, we were still anticipating that Illinois would reach Phase 5 on June 11th, and if that occurred, the Archdiocese would allow parishes to be open at 100% capacity. We were also anticipating that the new mask guideline for Archdiocesan parishes would be that vaccinated individuals do not need to wear masks in church. Those who have not been vaccinated would be encouraged to continue to wear masks, but this would be done on the honor system, as no one will be checking anyone's vaccination status, of course. I'm hoping that by the time you read this article on this weekend, this new guideline will be in effect.

And as more people continue to return to church (we pray!) I want to take this opportunity to let everyone know of the different ways that we are trying to incorporate various items from St. Maria Goretti (SMG) church into the St. Beatrice church building for our new Holy Virgin Martyrs Parish. The newest items that you might have noticed are the memorial books right inside the church main entrance. The book on the left of the table was from SMG, and it was one of the parish's traditions. Whenever a funeral was celebrated at the parish, if the deceased person's family chose to, they would place the holy card from their loved one's funeral in this book, and the book remains in church. This way, it is not only a way to honor the deceased, but it also helps the family to feel that their loved one is still with them in church when they come to Mass.

As I said, the memorial book on the left side of the table is the one from SMG. The book on the right side of the table is a new memorial book for Holy Virgin Martyrs Parish. As we go forward, if you would like to add your deceased loved one's holy card to the book, please feel free to do so. As I said, this book will remain at the back of church to honor our deceased loved ones.

I also want to make sure to mention some other items that we have brought over from SMG – some are big, and some are small, so you may not have noticed them all. Some of the SMG items that we have incorporated into the church here are: the bulletin racks at the two parking lot entrances; the altar cross (the small cross that lies flat on the front of the altar); the candles and candle stands at the altar and ambo (lectern); the Paschal candle behind the baptismal font; the SMG 50th anniversary Good Shepherd picture by the main entrance; the mosaic of St. Maria Goretti by the main entrance; the St. Maria Goretti statue by the Holy Family side altar. As time goes on, we will try to incorporate some more items if we can (e.g., we plan to bring over the large holy water dispenser, and at some point we will install one of the statues of St. Maria Goretti in the outdoor prayer garden).

Finally, I mentioned last week about the construction beginning on our new, accessible parish hall and meeting rooms. I will update you on this as the construction moves along, but for now, please remember that this will be a big job, which means it requires a lot of funding. The exterior ramp is being donated, but there is still a lot that will need to be done inside the building. We will be doing fundraisers for this at some point this summer. For now, please remember that you can continue to help us right now in two important ways. First, you can always buy our Hypod raffle tickets at any time. Hypod tickets are \$10 each, and every ticket is good for every weekly drawing of the year, for a prize of either \$100 or \$500. Hypod tickets are available at the pamphlet rack at the back of church, or at the rectory. Simply fill them out and drop them off in the Sunday collection or at the rectory, along with your payment.

The second way to help is by making your Sunday donations online, where you can set up an automatic recurring donation (weekly, monthly, yearly). Automatic donations greatly help a parish to know that there will be a regular, dependable flow of income, especially during the summer months. If you do not already donate online, please consider doing so. Go to [www.hvmparish.org](http://www.hvmparish.org) and click on "Donate by E-Giving," which will take you to our PayPal page. And I want to offer a big thank-you to all our current PayPal donors, and to everyone who donates to HVM Parish!

## FEAST OF FAITH

### The Preparation of the Altar

The altar is the focal point of our churches. It is a sign of Christ in our midst; indeed, it has been said that "the altar is Christ" (*Dedication of an Altar*, 4). The altar is a table "on which the sacrifice of the cross is perpetuated in mystery throughout the ages until Christ comes"; but it is also the place for a festive meal: "a table at which the Church's children assemble to give thanks to God and receive the body and blood of Christ" (*Dedication of an Altar*, 4).

Both these functions of the altar are clear in the rites for the preparation of the altar that follow the general intercessions, which remind us of the preparations we make at home for a festive meal. The deacon or altar servers come forward and, bowing, place a cloth known as a corporal (from the Latin for "body") over the altar cloth. They place the chalice, the cup to be used in the celebration of the Eucharist, and the *Sacramentary* or *Roman Missal*, which contains the prayers of the Mass, on the altar. These reverent preparations help us to focus on what is about to happen: the sharing of a holy meal, a solemn sacrifice.







## THE CHURCH AND GOD'S KINGDOM

Today's scriptures connect the towering cedars of Lebanon from the prophet Ezekiel to the mustard plant of the famous parable of Jesus. Both plants represent the Kingdom of God. Both are also to be understood as symbols of the Church, where "birds of every kind shall dwell" (Ezekiel 17:23) and shelter in the cedar's branches, and the shade of the mustard plant's large branches provide dwelling for the "birds of the sky." Even today's psalm tells of the just one who is like a cedar flourishing in the house of the Lord.

Now, the Church is not the Kingdom, but rather a sacrament, a visible sign of it. They co-exist in the here-and-now but also in the "not yet." As Paul reminds us, we must constantly work to continue building and growing the Kingdom by everyday good works of "the just one." So we are all birds and just ones.

"LET ME TELL YOU ABOUT THE KINGDOM OF GOD . . ."

The Gospel of Mark is nothing if not a testament to the power of parables to illustrate the Good News through story. Jesus was a master storyteller, who understood the importance of using images and concepts to which his listeners could relate. A seed, a mustard plant, would symbolize one of Mark's signature focuses: the Kingdom of God.

Centuries earlier, the prophet Ezekiel proclaimed most poetically to the Israelites, recently liberated from Babylonian captivity, that their God was still their hope, their comfort, their rescue, and their shelter. Those refugees would understand the image of the towering cedar as a symbol of their kingdom, cut down, fallen, captured. By restoring their kingdom, their God was giving them a new creation (the replanted shoot) and a new covenant.

## THY KINGDOM COME . . .

Ezekiel said that God would tear off "a tender shoot" (17:22) for this replanting. What does this sound like? Why, Advent, of course, and specifically the words of the prophet Isaiah: "A shoot shall sprout from the stump of Jesse, and from his roots a bud shall blossom" (Isaiah 11:1); and again in Isaiah's Messianic texts we hear: "He grew up before us like a tender shoot" (53:2). Jesse was the father of the great king David and, as we know, Jesus came to be that tender shoot, that blossom, the new Davidic King whose throne, the cross, was once a tree.

God's incarnation in Jesus, born fully human, is the fulfillment of the promise to Ezekiel of the renewed and restored cedar, the new Kingdom. That new creation and covenant exists for us in the Church, through the Holy Spirit making the seed planted within us grow, flourish, and spread. Thus we have the faith and courage to be that visible sign of the Kingdom bringing hope and renewal to the world. We must live Kingdom lives before we can convince others to do so.
