## *From the Pastor's Desk*

Happy 4<sup>th</sup> of July! To those of you who made the effort to join us for Mass on this holiday weekend, I want to thank you for being here; we're happy that you can celebrate the Eucharist with us!

Every time that we come to this month of July, I often like to share that this is my absolute favorite month of the year because it falls within the heart of summer. If it were up to me, every month of the year would be July! Anyway, sorry, I digress.

The other reason why I want to acknowledge the month of July is that this month is very significant for our Holy Virgin Martyrs Parish, and that's because the feast days of our two patron saints fall within July. We begin and end the month by focusing on our patrons: On July 6<sup>th</sup> we celebrate the feast of St. Maria Goretti, and on July 29<sup>th</sup> we celebrate the feast of St. Beatrice. Both of our patrons were virgins (they chose to dedicate their lives to Christ) and martyrs (they gave up their lives for Christ). Thus, our new parish name honors both of them.

St. Maria Goretti and St. Beatrice lived centuries apart – St. Beatrice died around the year 303, and St. Maria Goretti died in 1902. Personally, I think it's great that we have two patrons who lived 1,600 years apart, because their lives show us that, from the beginning of the Church, and down through the centuries to our present day, we have had so many virtuous saints who put God at the center of their lives. And while the Church of the 21<sup>st</sup> century is seeking to revitalize and grow, one thing we can be sure of is that God continues to send holy men and women into our midst to give us good examples on our path of discipleship. So, as we honor our patron saints this month, let us not only seek out courageous and faithful people like St. Beatrice and St. Maria Goretti, but let us also strive to be like them.

Incidentally, the relics of both St. Beatrice and St. Maria Goretti will be on display at the front of church throughout this month. And if you would like to read more about our patrons, check out our website at [www.hvmparish.org/our-patron-saints](http://www.hvmparish.org/our-patron-saints).

Also this weekend, I need to mention something that I've addressed several times before, but I know that some parishioners have just recently been coming back, so they might not have heard this. Although we became a new canonical parish on Oct. 1, 2020, and although we have a new parish name, we do not have new parish bank accounts yet. Basically, we cannot get new accounts until we have an updated federal tax ID, and we are holding off on obtaining that until we apply for forgiveness for the second draw Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loan. You see, our second PPP loan was applied for under St. Beatrice's name, because at that point last year we were not yet a new parish. So, if we receive a new federal ID now, but then apply for forgiveness for the federal loan with the St. Beatrice ID, that will complicate things. So, we need to wait until we can apply for forgiveness for the second PPP loan (and that portal is not open yet). Once our forgiveness application is accepted, we can then move ahead with changing our tax ID, and once we do that, we can get new bank accounts and parish envelopes. What this means for you is: **Until you hear otherwise from me, please continue to make checks out to either "St. Beatrice," or "St. Maria Goretti," but not to "Holy Virgin Martyrs."**

Finally, please also remember that one of the easiest ways to support our parish is by shopping online at [smile.amazon.com](https://smile.amazon.com), which is the charitable arm of Amazon. When you go to that site, you can choose a charity to support. Please choose "St. Beatrice Church" from their list (we are still listed with AmazonSmile as St. Beatrice because, again, we do not have our new tax ID yet, so that will eventually need to change). Once you do that, you do not need to do anything else. Anytime you shop online at AmazonSmile after that, a small percentage of your purchase price will be donated to our parish. I recently received an email from AmazonSmile stating that \$123 have been donated to our parish so far this year. Please consider supporting us in this way, and thank you to those of you who already do!

Holy Virgin Martyrs, pray for us. May God bless you.

## Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel the people exclaim: "What mighty deeds are wrought by his hands!" Because of your gift to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul many "mighty deeds" are accomplished for the poor.

**This week put a gift in the St. Vincent de Paul poor box, knowing that through your kindness someone who is suffering will be touched by God in a miraculous way.**

### FEAST OF FAITH Little Mysteries

Two small rites—or, as one liturgist has called them, "little mysteries"—accompany the preparation of the gifts. The priest or deacon takes a small cruet of water from the server and adds a drop of water to the wine. Then, after the elevation of the chalice (and the incensation, if incense is used), the priest washes his hands. Both of these actions were at first practical, matter-of-fact realities: in the ancient world the wine was usually quite thick, and was generally mixed with water before it was drunk. And in the early church, when the faithful brought forward a great variety of gifts at this time, there was a definite need for the presider to wash his hands!

But now these rites serve a purely symbolic function. The mingling of the water and wine is accompanied by a prayer that speaks of the wonderful exchange of the Mass, the mingling of Christ's divinity and our humanity. And as the priest washes his hands, he prays words of supplication from Psalm 51, acknowledging his own sinfulness in the presence of the assembly before he dares to approach the altar for this most sacred action.





## PAYING THE PRICE

In the Sunday Lectionary, the first reading is usually chosen from anywhere in the Hebrew Bible to tie together with the Gospel. Currently, the second reading is from Saint Paul's second letter to the Corinthians. Often the second reading is not so closely related to the day's Gospel selection, because those books are read in a more continuous fashion from week to week. But today, all three of the scripture readings go together very well. Ezekiel struggles with the job he is given by the Lord, speaking to a rebellious people. Paul is dealing with a “thorn in his side,” that is, the difficulties of his own personal weakness and foibles, and learning to rely on God's grace. Mark's Gospel introduces us to a Jesus who is struggling to be believed and accepted in his native country. In all three passages, the major figures are following the will of God and paying the price of rejection by the community for their efforts.

## I DON'T GET NO RESPECT

Years ago there was a popular comedian named Rodney Dangerfield, and he would riff about his family life or his work and his catchphrase was “I don't get no respect!” You knew this refrain was coming, and was part of the punch line, so you waited to hear it and usually laughed or groaned with it. The idea of Jesus being disrespected is a much more foreign feeling. It is easy to forget that Jesus was both human and divine. We can easily romanticize his life and ministry and forget his struggles and the difficulty he had being heard, understood, and respected, especially in his own country. Placed in the larger context of Mark's story, this was very early in Jesus' ministry, and the message he was proclaiming was not what the people wanted to hear. Jesus was not speaking about the Messiah that the Jews were hoping for. Add that together with the fact that people are often hardest on their own. Somehow “local boy makes good” just didn't sit well with them, and they didn't want to have anything to do with Jesus or his message. Jesus was caught off guard by this.

## A MESSAGE FOR OUR TIME

There are times when being Catholic, or even being Christian is very countercultural. It used to be you belonged to a parish, and that was your home, based on your geographic boundaries or ethnicity. But now people change parishes depending on pastors, styles of music, or the Mass schedule. In these days of Covid-19, many who stayed away because of social distancing have not yet found their way back. Many never recovered from their disillusionment over the abuse scandals. Others left Catholicism for non-denominational churches, or explored other paths such as Buddhism. Still others consider themselves “spiritual but not religious” or are labeled “nones.” Frequently, families who once sat together every week in church are now scattered all over the spiritual spectrum. In the face of all this, let us pray for the strength of Ezekiel to continue to preach our faith by the lives we live, despite everything in our culture that rebels against religion. May we have the wisdom of Paul to persevere despite our weaknesses and the thorns in our side. And like Jesus, may we always find the faith we need to endure, even when those around us do not.
