

## *From the Pastor's Desk*

First, I'd like to thank you for joining us for the celebration of the Eucharist on this holiday weekend, especially if you are visiting from out of town. We're glad that you're with us.

I'd also like to thank all those who offered prayers and well wishes to me and some of the rectory staff. As you may have heard, two weeks ago a couple of staff members and I tested positive for Covid-19. Thankfully, our symptoms were relatively mild. We reported it to the Archdiocese and quarantined for the required number of days, and I'm happy to say that we're all doing better. Many parishioners expressed support and concern, and we very much appreciate it. Let's continue to pray that we all stay safe during this ongoing pandemic. And as a reminder, masks are required to be worn inside all parish buildings, regardless of vaccination status.

Continuing with my words of thanks, I'd also like to thank all those who stopped by the estate sale last weekend. The seller, Katherine Powers, not only donated the proceeds from the sale to our parish, but she also matched the total amount. Thanks to her, and those who came to the sale, and one parishioner family who made an extraordinary donation, we raised \$11,600 for the parish!

Our other fundraiser that is just about to conclude is Football Mania (FM). Each \$20 FM ticket gives you 17 chances to win a cash prize ranging from \$25-\$400. Every year we always have some unsold tickets that turn out to be winners, so don't let the tickets go to waste! This is the final weekend to buy FM tickets at the back of church, as the NFL regular season begins on Sep. 9<sup>th</sup>.

And as this fundraiser concludes, I will also be talking about a new, significant fundraiser next week (please remember, we are still trying to recover from the shutdown and decreased attendance during this pandemic). This fundraiser has to do with me running in my tenth Chicago Marathon to support the construction of our new Parish Hall. I'll say more about it next weekend. And FYI, my Sunday triathlons are now finished for the season (I have one tri left, but it is on a Saturday morning). So, you'll see me around more now at all the weekend Masses.

Don't forget that our Religious Ed. classes will be starting soon – Sep. 11<sup>th</sup> for those who choose the Saturday morning classes, and Sep. 14<sup>th</sup> for the Tuesday evening classes. ## Twenty—Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel we hear how Jesus "makes the deaf hear and the mute speak!" In living the gospel, we must open our ears to hear and recognize all the everyday opportunities for making God's presence known especially to those who are poor and suffering. On September 9, the Church also celebrates the feast of Blessed Frederic Ozanam, the founder of the society of St. Vincent de Paul. Frederic heard the call of Jesus to love and serve those who are suffering.

## FEAST OF FAITH Remembering

When Jesus broke the bread on the night before he died, he told his disciples, "do this in memory of me" (Luke 22:19). Christians have been faithful to that solemn command. Our eucharistic remembering is not nostalgia, nor is it merely historical, recalling events and facts of long ago. In the liturgy, remembering is action. "Do this," Jesus said. In the Eucharist, we remember by doing. And as we remember, the sacrifice of Jesus is renewed, truly made present, no longer then, but now.

After the consecration, each of the Eucharistic Prayers includes a section called the *anamnesis*, a Greek word that means "remembering." In this part of the prayer, "the Church, fulfilling the command that she received from Christ the Lord through the Apostles, keeps the memorial of Christ, recalling especially his blessed Passion, glorious Resurrection, and Ascension into heaven" (*General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, 79e). We pause and call to mind the whole paschal mystery, Christ's dying and rising. "We celebrate the memory of his death and resurrection" (*Eucharistic Prayer for Reconciliation II*). Obeying Christ's command, we remember.

## The Messiah Foretold

Today's story of the cure of a deaf man with a speech impediment is a good example of how much is contained in a simple miracle story. The Greek word *mogilalos* appears only here in all of the New Testament. It is a technical term referring to someone with a stammer. It is also used only once in the entire Jewish scriptures, in the passage that we read today as our first reading from Isaiah. Clearly, by his choice of this precise word Mark wants us to recognize that what Jesus is doing is the fulfillment of what Isaiah had predicted centuries earlier. In fact, Mark wants us to recognize that Jesus is the Messiah foretold by Isaiah and the other Jewish prophets of old.

The word *ephphatha*, "be opened," used to describe the restoration of the man's speech, is another example of a subtle allusion to an earlier prophecy. This time the prophecy in question is from Ezekiel, when he foretells that in the messianic age, "your mouth shall be opened to speak" (24:26). The sophistication of Mark's narrative is further revealed when we realize that there are multiple levels within a single reference. Mark not only draws our attention back to Israel's prophetic past, he also points to the initiatory practice of his contemporaries by his mention of such things as spittle, touching of ears, and the use of the word *ephphatha*, all of which were practices incorporated into the early Church's baptismal ritual.

I have a volunteer opportunity for anyone interested in being able to bring Communion to the home bound. We are looking for some new recruits to be part of our Ministers of Care team. We already have a good group that are very devoted but looking to expand as we now have united our two former parishes. There is a training class which will be held at St Benedict Village, Nursing and Rehabilitation, in Niles. The five-week training for new Ministers of Care will begin Wednesday, September 29th and continue thru the next 4 consecutive Wednesday evenings until October 27th, from 7-9 pm. Chaplain Rick Nash and retired priests who live at St. Benedict will, be facilitating these classes. There is no charge to you for this course, and I can tell you from personal experience it's a very rewarding ministry to be able to bring Jesus (Communion) to your fellow parishioners who can't come to church for themselves. It's not a big commitment a phone call to set up a time, and about 20mins. to visit, pray and bring communion. It could be once a week but can be even less than that. ## Flu shots

We will be offering Flu shots in the back of church on Tuesday October 5th after the morning mass from 9:15- 10:15AM. We will be able to offer both the standard dose and the high dose flu vaccines this year. The high dose vaccine is needed for immune suppressed individuals and recommended for seniors over 65. It is free to all those on

Medicare, please bring your card, so we have the number to fill the form out for billing. Anyone under 65 the cost will be \$25. We ask you to call the rectory to reserve your vaccine and give your name and which vaccine you wish to receive (Standard or High dose), so we have enough for everyone who wants the vaccine. If you have any questions call the rectory with your name and number and I will get back to you.

Also, anyone who is homebound and wishes to get the flu shot call the rectory with your name, address, and phone number. I will be bringing flu shots to the homebound later that same day October 5th.

CDC recommends everyone 6 months of age and older to get a flu vaccine every year. Flu vaccines can reduce flu illnesses, doctors' visits, and missed work and school due to flu, as well as prevent flu-related hospitalizations and deaths.
