From the Pastor's Desk

As I mentioned last week, in this month of July we honor our parish's two patron saints. St. Maria Goretti's feast day was on July 6, and St. Beatrice's feast day is on July 29. Throughout this month we have relics of these two holy women, our patrons, on display at the front of church.

In this month we are also continuing our work inside the church on the flat ceiling, as we install new ceiling tiles, new lighting, and additional speakers. We will also have other maintenance projects taking place in the coming months, and I look forward to sharing those with you.

Looking ahead to next week, our parish nurse, Nancy Ryan, will be offering blood pressure screenings at Sunday Masses. It will take place after the 9:30am & 11:30am Masses next Sunday, July 16, in the Gathering Room at the back of church. Please feel free to stop by to get your blood pressure checked, and to talk with our parish nurse.

Finally, below are the Catholic trivia questions that I shared last week, along with the answers. How did you do?

Q: The following ten countries have the highest number of Catholics in the world: Brazil, Columbia, Democratic Republic of Congo, France, Italy, Mexico, the Philippines, Poland, Spain, and USA. Put them in their correct order, #1 to #10, highest to lowest Catholic populations.

A: The country with the most Catholics is Brazil, followed by Mexico, the Philippines, USA, Italy, Columbia, France, Poland, Spain, and the Democratic Republic of Congo. These ten countries account for over half of the world's Catholic population.

Q: The Catholic version of the Old Testament does not have the same number of books as the Protestant version. Does the Catholic Bible have more or fewer books, and how many?

A: There are seven more books in the Catholic Old Testament. They are: Tobit, Judith, 1 Maccabees, 2 Maccabees, Wisdom, Sirach, and Baruch. These books were removed from Protestant Bibles by Martin Luther during the Protestant Reformation.

Q: Vatican City has one of the highest rates in the world.

A: Vatican City has one of the highest crime rates in the world, around 130%, meaning there are more annual offenses than there are people in the Vatican. However, the crime is largely perpetuated by tourists, and it often consists of purse snatching, pickpocketing, and shoplifting in St. Peter's Square.

Q: The Devil's Advocate is an actual position within the Catholic Church, and it has to do with:

A: The office of the Devil's Advocate (*Advocate Diaboli*) has to do with the canonization of saints. The official title of the office is Promoter of the Faith (*Promotor Fidei*). This person's role is to oversee the beatification and canonization of saints, to make sure that a decision is not made hastily, and that all the claims about a person are true. The position requires the Promoter to seek out and find objections to why the individual should be a saint, and the Promoter also has the power to veto the beatification or canonization of a potential saint.

Q: The magical term "hocus pocus" has Catholic roots. It comes from:

A: "Hocus pocus" comes from the consecration of the bread as the Body of Christ. The priest speaks the words, "This is my body," which in Latin is *Hoc est enim corpus meum*.

About Our Program

Our religious education classes meet twice a month either Tuesday evenings from 6:00—8:00pm or Saturday mornings from 9:00—11:30am at the Wagner Street entrance of the religious education building. We also have a homeschool (e-learning)option available. We are committed to giving our students in grades K—8 the tools they need to grow and mature in their faith by:

- **†** Gathering for prayer every class
- † Celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation during Advent and Lent
- † Encouraging faithful discipleship through the completion of Mass and service hours
- † Through enrichment opportunities like The Seder Meal, Church Tours, and Teaching Masses
- † Offering Opportunities for involvement in Mass by having our students read and bring up the gifts at our monthly Family Masses and by offering opportunities to join parish ministries like altar serving.

Help Wanted: Catechist, Aides

The Religious Education Program is looking for volunteers to be teacher's aides for the upcoming year. No previous experience is necessary. The responsibilities of a teacher's aide include:

- Helping to supervise children in class.
- *▶* Brining the attendance and other things to the office.
- Assisting the teacher with various tasks during class.
- Being a substitute teacher (if comfortable) or assisting a substitute teacher.
- Assisting the Coordinator with tasks as needed. Currently we need aides in the following grades:

Sacramental Information

The Religious Education program has a 2 year consecutive attendance requirement for the reception of the Sacraments of Communion and Confirmation. 1st Reconciliation & Communion are usually celebrated in 2nd grade and Confirmation is celebrated in 8th grade.

Students in grades 3-7 who need to receive the Sacraments of 1st Reconciliation & Communion will be enrolled in *Special Sacraments Class* in their second consecutive year of attendance in the religious education program. This is a separate class and meets one Saturday per month from 9-11am to prepare these students for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Communion.

Registration Information

Registration is open for the 2023—2024 school year! You <u>DO NOT</u> need to be a parishioner to enroll your child in the religious education program. Registration materials are available online and you can also enroll your child online by going to the children's faith formation page on the parish website hymparish.org and clicking on the link to fill out and submit your form online. You can also register on one of our registration days: Tuesday, August 22nd from 4:00-7:30pm and Saturday, August 26th from 9:00am—3:00pm at the

Wagner Street entrance of the religious education building. To enroll your child in the religious education program you will need the following:

- Completed Registration Form
- Tuition Payment
- A copy of your child's Baptism certificate
- A copy of your child's 1st Reconciliation & Communion certificates if applicable.




