From the Pastor's Desk

This Sunday, July 16, our parish nurse Nancy Ryan is offering blood pressure screenings after the 9:30am & 11:30am Masses in the Gathering Room at the back of church. Please feel free to stop by to get your blood pressure checked, and to talk with Nancy if you have any health concerns. I am grateful to Nancy for all that she does in helping to care for the physical and spiritual needs of HVM parishioners.

Since this is our patron saints' month, I thought this would be a good opportunity to remind everyone of the symbolism in our HVM Parish logo, as it has now been almost two years since we began using it. You can always find this logo on our bulletin cover, our parish website, our stationary, etc. I've also included the logo here so that you can see it as I describe its features.



The blue in the cross honors St. Beatrice Parish, as that was the color of St. Beatrice School. The red in the crown honors St. Maria Goretti Parish, as that was the color of St. Maria Goretti School. The crown at the top represents the martyrs' crown (the Church traditionally talks about a "crown of martyrdom" for those who died for Christ). As both St. Beatrice and St. Maria Goretti were martyrs, the crown represents each of them (and the red is also symbolic of the blood that they shed). The two lilies in the middle of the cross represent purity. Virgins in the Church are often pictured with lilies. Both St. Beatrice and St. Maria Goretti were virgins (which is also why we have two lilies in the logo, one for each of them).

And in honor of our two patron saints, whose feast days we celebrate this month, I'd like to conclude by sharing the post-Communion prayer that is used at a Mass for a virgin martyr's feast day (I've modified the prayer slightly to include both of our saints). It says:

O God, who bestowed on blessed Beatrice & Maria Goretti a crown among the Saints for their twofold triumph of virginity and martyrdom, grant, we pray, through the power of this Sacrament, that, bravely overcoming every evil, we may attain the glory of heaven. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Holy Virgin Martyrs, pray for us. May God bless you.

About Our Program

Our religious education classes meet twice a month either Tuesday evenings from 6:00—8:00pm or Saturday mornings from 9:00—11:30am at the Wagner Street entrance of the religious education building. We also have a homeschool (e-learning)option available. We are committed to giving our students in grades K—8 the tools they need to grow and mature in their faith by:

- **†** Gathering for prayer every class
- † Celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation during Advent and Lent
- † Encouraging faithful discipleship through the completion of Mass and service hours
- † Through enrichment opportunities like The Seder Meal, Church Tours, and Teaching Masses
- † Offering Opportunities for involvement in Mass by having our students read and bring up the gifts at our monthly Family Masses and by offering opportunities to join parish ministries like altar serving.

Help Wanted: Catechist, Aides

The Religious Education Program is looking for volunteers to be teacher's aides for the upcoming year. No previous experience is necessary. The responsibilities of a teacher's aide include:

- Helping to supervise children in class.
- Brining the attendance and other things to the office.
- Assisting the teacher with various tasks during class.
- Being a substitute teacher (if comfortable) or assisting a substitute teacher.
- Assisting the Coordinator with tasks as needed. Currently we need aides in the following grades: Tuesdays: 7th, and 8th

Saturdays: 1st, 3rd, 4th, 6th, 7th, 8th

Sacramental Information

The Religious Education program has a 2 year consecutive attendance requirement for the reception of the Sacraments of Communion and Confirmation. 1st Reconciliation & Communion are usually celebrated in 2nd grade and Confirmation is celebrated in 8th grade.

Students in grades 3-7 who need to receive the Sacraments of 1st Reconciliation & Communion will be enrolled in *Special Sacraments Class* in their second consecutive year of attendance in the religious education program. This is a separate class and meets one Saturday per month from 9-11am to prepare these students for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Communion.

Registration Information

Registration is open for the 2023—2024 school year! You <u>DO NOT</u> need to be a parishioner to enroll your child in the religious education program. Registration materials are available online and you can also enroll your child online by going to the children's faith formation page on the parish website hymparish.org and clicking on the link to fill out and submit your form online. You can also register on one of our registration days: Tuesday, August 22nd from 4:00-7:30pm and Saturday, August 26th from 9:00am—3:00pm at the

Wagner Street entrance of the religious education building. To enroll your child in the religious education program you will need the following:

- Completed Registration Form
- Tuition Payment
- A copy of your child's Baptism certificate
- A copy of your child's 1st Reconciliation & Communion certificates if applicable.

Notes From The Parish Nurse...

Happy and Healthy Summer to All!

I'd like to share some important information with you about Medicaid Redetermination Process which is happening for Medicaid enrollees. Illinois medical agencies are currently attempting to contact all members in order to verify eligibility. Prior to the Covid-19 era, members were verified yearly to be eligible to receive Medicaid benefits. The US Bureau of Statistics reported that at the peak of Covid, 5.4 million workers lost their health insurance due to layoffs. These persons were then enrolled into Medicaid for health insurance coverage. Now that the public health emergency for Covid has been lifted, all Medicaid enrollees need to again prove their eligibility status.

For those currently enrolled in Medicaid, it is important to make sure that your <u>contact information is up to fate (address and phone number)</u> with the state in order to receive these notifications, especially for participants that have recently changed addresses.

If you would like some assistance in determining what benefits or programs you may qualify for, you can contact Advocatia, an Ascension community partner, for a free confidential screening of your eligibility for Medicaid benefits.

Advocatia can assist with Medicaid, Healthcare Marketplace, CHIP, SNAP, and Adult Healthcare Immigration Assistance eligibility.


