From the Pastor's Desk

I have a lot to cover this weekend. First, I will not see you next weekend, as I will be in Muncie, IN to compete in the first of my two big races that I'm calling "Fr. Rob's 96.5 miles on Insanity." This Saturday, Sep. 30th, I will swim, bike, and run a total of 70.3 miles in the Muncie Ironman 70.3. I'll then spend the following week recovering as much as I can, because on Sunday, Oct. 8th I will run 26.2 miles in the Chicago Marathon. As I've said, I'm doing these 96.5 miles of racing to raise money for new carpeting in our church. If you would like to donate to this fundraiser, please go to hymparish.org, click on Donate, and then be sure to write "Carpet" in the Notes section. If you prefer to donate by cash or check, you can use the envelopes that are in the pews, or use a blank envelope. For checks, please be sure to make them out to "Holy Virgin Martyrs Parish" and write "Carpet" in the memo line. You can drop your envelope in the Sunday collection basket at any time, even after the two races are over (there is no deadline). I want to thank all those who have already donated, and those who may still donate. We could not do this carpet project without you.

I also wanted to let you know (because some people have asked) that you can track my progress in each race if you're interested. At the time I wrote this, I did not yet have my assigned bib numbers for each race. However, you can search for me by just typing in my name (and if there is more than one Robert Schultz in the race, it should also list me as being from Schiller Park). Each of the race websites should have a link that will be active on the day of the race. For the Ironman 70.3 on Sep. 30, go to www.ironman.com/im703-muncie, and for the Marathon on Oct. 8, go to www.chicagomarathon.com.

On Saturday, Oct. 7th, we will have our annual Blessing of Animals, in connection with the feast day of St. Francis of Assisi (Oct. 4th). The blessing will take place in the parking lot, by the Prayer Garden, at 12:00pm. All animals are welcome!

Our HVM Women's Club will be hosting a Pasta Dinner & Raffle on Saturday, October 14th in Hendle Hall. Tickets are on sale at the back of church. The dinner will be catered by Cuomo Catering, and includes baked rigatoni, meatballs and sausage, and garden salad. Desserts and open bar are also included in the cost. Tickets are \$20 for adults, \$15 for children 5-10 years old, and children under 4 are free. I hope you can join us!

As I spoke about at the Masses last weekend, the Archdiocese has officially closed on the sale of the St. Maria Goretti campus to Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Church (who has been renting there for the past 2½ years). As I said last weekend, I know that this is a painful experience for all those who were parishioners at SMG, but I hope that it can be a little comforting to know that not only will the church not be torn down, but it will also continue to function as a church, especially by a congregation (Greek Orthodox) with whom the Catholic Church shares a close communion. I know that Holy Trinity Parish is extremely grateful to be there, as their congregation would have been homeless if this sale had not happened. And as a reminder, Holy Trinity is not purchasing the grass field next to the SMG parking lot, so the Archdiocese is still trying to sell that property.

Finally, I would like to announce and congratulate this year's winners of the Christifidelis Award, which is given annually by Cardinal Cupich to parishioners who have exemplified outstanding service at their parishes. This year I nominated Steve and Cathy Schreiner. I want to thank them for all that they do for HVM Parish. When I submitted their nomination, here is what I wrote about why I believe they deserve this award:

"Steve and Cathy have been active parishioners for many years, both at St. Maria Goretti and now at Holy Virgin Martyrs. Cathy worked at SMG School, is a member of the Women's Club, organizes the Mother's Day & Father's Day Spiritual Bouquets, and serves as a Bereavement Minister. Steve serves as an usher and altar server at Masses. Together, they serve on the Evangelization and Alpha teams, serve on Parish Council, are Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Ministers of Care, organize First Saturday devotions, and served as catechists and aides in Religious Ed. They are always willing to help in any way that is needed."

Notes From The Parish Nurse

Flu shots will be offered in the gathering room at the back of church on Tuesday, October 17, 2023 after the morning Mass from 9:15-10:15am. The standard and high dose flu vaccine will be available.

The CDC recommends the flu vaccine yearly for those 6 months of age and older ("with rare exceptions") and per the CDC, "everyone should receive a flu vaccine that is appropriate for their age and health status." Getting vaccinated helps to reduce flu-related illnesses, doctor visits, missed work and missed school as well as flu-related hospitalizations or deaths. The high dose flu vaccine is

recommended for seniors over the age of 65 and is designed to create a stronger immune response for better protection against influenza. For more information check out CDC.gov. The flu vaccine will be provided at no cost to all those on Medicare (Part B); please remember to bring your Medicare card to the flu clinic. The charge for those under age 65 will be \$25, although a waiver may be provided depending on financial need.

If interested, please call the rectory to reserve your vaccine by giving your name and which type of flu vaccine you wish to receive (standard or high dose) in order to make sure that there is enough supply for those who want to receive the vaccine.

I will also be able to bring the flu vaccine to homebound parishioners later that same day on October 17th. For anyone who is homebound and wishes to receive the flu vaccine, please call the rectory to provide your name, address, and phone number, so that I may contact you.


Commemorate the 106th Anniversary of Our Lady of Fatima
