# From the Pastor's Desk

Happy Advent, and Happy New Year! Yes, this weekend we begin not only the season of Advent, but we also begin a new liturgical year. At the Masses this weekend, we bless our Advent wreath, and we light the first candle on it, as we prepare our hearts to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ on December 25<sup>th</sup>.

One of the best ways to prepare for this is by celebrating the sacrament of Reconciliation. **Our annual Advent confessions will be offered on Tuesday, Dec. 12**<sup>th</sup> **from 7-8pm in church**. There will not be a prayer service that night. Instead, you are welcome to come anytime between 7-8pm for individual confession, and several priests will be available.

This coming Friday, Dec. 8<sup>th</sup>, we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary's Immaculate Conception, which refers to Mary being conceived without sin inside the womb of her mother, St. Anne. This is a Holy Day of Obligation. However, Dec. 8<sup>th</sup> falls on a Friday this year, and because we may get fewer people at a Friday night Mass, the Mass schedule for this will be slightly different. **Masses for the Immaculate Conception will be at 7:00pm on Thursday, Dec. 7<sup>th</sup>, and at 8:30am & 12:00pm on Friday, Dec. 8<sup>th</sup>.** 

I hope that you can join us for our Parish Christmas Party. It will take place next Sunday, Dec. 10<sup>th</sup> at Allegra Banquets in Schiller Park. Doors open at 2pm, and dinner will be served at 3pm, with a cash bar. Dinner tickets are \$35. You can buy them at Mass this weekend, or at the rectory up until Wednesday, Dec. 6<sup>th</sup>. In addition to the dinner tickets, we are also selling raffle tickets. At the Christmas Party, we will have a raffle for several prizes, including gift baskets, as well as several cash prizes: three \$100 prizes, one \$200 prize, and one \$500 grand prize. Raffle tickets (sold separately from the dinner tickets) are \$5 each, or six for \$25. You do not need to be present at the Christmas Party to win, and you can buy raffle tickets up until the drawing begins.

Another great opportunity to win money comes from one of our most popular fundraisers, the HYPOD raffle (HYPOD stands for Help Your Parish Out of Debt). HYPOD tickets are \$10. You can purchase them at the rectory, and they are also available in the pamphlet rack at the back of church (the green tickets). And while HYPOD tickets can be purchased anytime throughout the year, the best time to get them is now. That is because every ticket that you buy is valid for every weekly drawing of the year (because even if your ticket wins, it goes back into the pot for the next week's drawing). The weekly prize is either \$100 or \$500. It is possible to win more than once with one ticket. The first drawings for 2024 will begin in January, so any 2024 ticket that you buy before then will be valid for all 52 drawings of the year.

Finally, I want to give everyone a heads-up about our Christmas Mass schedule. Because Christmas falls on a Monday this year, the schedule might be a little confusing. That is because the weekend of Dec. 23-24 is the Fourth Sunday of Advent, and we will have our normal weekend Mass schedule: 4:30pm on Dec. 23<sup>rd</sup>, and 9:30am & 11:30am on Dec. 24<sup>th</sup>. But once we get into the afternoon of Dec. 24<sup>th</sup>, we then move into Christmas Eve. We will have two Christmas Eve Masses on Dec. 24<sup>th</sup>, at 4:00pm and Midnight. Then, on Christmas Day, Dec. 25<sup>th</sup>, we will have Masses at 9:30am & 11:30am. This means that there will be four Masses on Sunday, Dec. 24<sup>th</sup>, but the two morning ones will be for the Fourth Sunday of Advent, and the afternoon and evening Masses will be for Christmas. If this sounds confusing, don't worry, we will be publishing the schedule, and I will remind everyone more about it in the coming weeks.




