# From the Pastor's Desk

Even though this is only the Second Sunday of Advent, we're already almost halfway through the Advent season. That is because this year we have the shortest possible Advent season – it will only last for three weeks and a few hours. That is because Christmas falls on a Monday this year. You see, there always needs to be four <u>Sundays</u> in Advent, but not necessarily four <u>weeks</u>. This year, the Fourth Sunday of Advent falls on Dec. 24<sup>th</sup>, which means that a few hours after we begin the Fourth Sunday, we then arrive at Christmas Eve and the start of the Christmas season.

Keep in mind that there will be two <u>separate</u> Mass obligations between Dec. 23-25: attending a Fourth Sunday of Advent Mass, and attending a Christmas Mass. This is what the Mass schedule will be for Dec. 23-25:

For the Fourth Sunday of Advent, we will have our normal weekend Mass schedule: 4:30pm on Dec. 23<sup>rd</sup>, and 9:30am & 11:30am on Dec. 24<sup>th</sup>.

For Christmas, we will have two Christmas Eve Masses on Dec. 24<sup>th</sup>: 4:00pm and Midnight. On Christmas Day, Dec. 25<sup>th</sup>, we will have two Masses: 9:30am & 11:30am.

If you notice, this means that there will be four Masses on Sunday, Dec. 24<sup>th</sup>, but the two morning ones will be for the Fourth Sunday of Advent, and the afternoon and evening Masses will be for Christmas. So again, the obligation for Catholics is to attend <u>one</u> Mass for the Fourth Sunday of Advent (on either Dec. 23 or 24), and <u>one</u> Mass for Christmas (on either Dec. 24 or Dec. 25).

But going back to what I said earlier, this is a short Advent season, and Christmas is only two weeks away. The purpose of Advent is to help us prepare our hearts to welcome Christ at Christmas. And one of the best ways to do that is by celebrating the sacrament of Reconciliation. **Our annual Advent confessions will be offered this Tuesday, Dec. 12<sup>th</sup> from 7-8pm in church**. There will not be a prayer service. Instead, you are welcome to come anytime between 7-8pm for individual confession, and several priests will be available.

I also want to invite everyone to another Advent event that is designed to help us get into the spirit of the Christmas season. Our annual Christmas Concert, called the Infancy Narrative, will take place on Wednesday, Dec. 20<sup>th</sup> at 7:00pm in church. At this free concert, our parish choir will sing beloved Christmas carols, interspersed with readings of the Gospel stories of Jesus' birth. Take a break from the busyness of December and come listen to the stories and music that remind us of the reason for the season.

Finally, the 2024 HYPOD raffle tickets are now available (HYPOD stands for <u>Help Your Parish Out of Debt</u>). HYPOD tickets are \$10. You can purchase them at the rectory, and they will also be available in the pamphlet rack at the back of church (they are green tickets). And while HYPOD tickets can be purchased anytime throughout the year, the best time to get them is <u>now!</u> That is because every ticket that you buy is valid for every weekly drawing of the year (because even if your ticket wins, it goes back into the pot for the next week's drawing). The weekly prize is either \$100 or \$500. It is possible to win more than once with one ticket. The first drawings for 2024 will begin in January, so any 2024 ticket that you buy before then will be valid for all 52 drawings of the year.

What We're Learning

#### <u>Advent</u>

We learned about the liturgical season of Advent. We learned that it is theperiod of time before Christmas that we use to prepare ourselves for Jesus' coming. We learned that Advent helps us to focus on the three comings of Jesus - in history by his birth in Bethlehem, in mystery by the ways we encounter Jesus in our daily lives especially in the sacraments, and in majesty when Jesus will return at the end of time to reign over God's kingdom. We learned that the liturgical color for Advent is purple. During Advent in church, we have a large Advent wreath, the wreath has four candles. Each week we light a candle. Three candles are purple - which represent the sacrifices we are making. One candle is pink, which is lit on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Advent. It represents our joy that we are half way to Christmas. To help us prepare for Jesus' coming our 3-5 grade students will celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation with Fr. Rob during our classes on December  $16^{\text{th}}$  &  $19^{\text{th}}$ .

## **Notes From The Parish Nurse...**

November was Diabetes Awareness Month. With that in mind, I wanted to take this opportunity to provide some information to you about Diabetes Mellitus, more commonly known as Diabetes.

Diabetes is a chronic health disorder when the body does not make enough insulin or does not utilize it well enough, therefore permitting glucose (from the food we eat) into the bloodstream for sustained periods of time.

You may be familiar with the three main types of Diabetes: Type 1 where you need to take insulin daily, Type 2 where you may need medication or insulin to manage it, and Gestational Diabetes which may develop in pregnant women, and medications are sometimes used to help control blood sugar levels to help keep mom and baby healthy. There is also a Prediabetes category where blood sugar levels are higher than normal but not high enough for the diagnosis of diabetes.

As a result of elevated blood glucose levels over time, other diabetic health related issues can potentially develop including heart, kidney, or vision diseases.

Regardless of which category a person may find themselves in, it is essential to collaborate with your health care provider with the ultimate goals of controlling your blood sugar and following a healthy lifestyle. Staying active is very important, eating a healthy diet, and learning your healthy weight. Your health care provider can help provide resources to help with those goals.

According to the Centers for Disease Control, over 37 million people have diabetes with over 28 million diagnosed, and over 8 million undiagnosed and unaware of their diagnosis. According to the American Diabetes Association, 1.4 million people will be diagnosed with diabetes this year.

Some Diabetes symptoms to be aware of are:

Frequent urination, excessive thirst or hunger, loss of weight without trying, extreme fatigue, sores that heal slowly. If you have any of these symptoms or any other concerns, it is important to contact your health care provider and discuss getting your blood sugar tested. Hope this information proves to be helpful.
