From the Pastor's Desk

On this Third Sunday of Advent, one question that is often asked is, "Why is one of the Advent candles pink?" Well, this Sunday is the "pink" Sunday (that's an unofficial name, of course!) This Third Sunday of Advent is known as Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete means "rejoice." The color rose (or pink) is used on this "rejoice" weekend, as opposed to the darker shade of purple (and if you're a keen observer, you may have noticed that the lights on our trees in church have changed from purple to pink this weekend). The use of the brighter rose color symbolizes our rejoicing that we are past the halfway point of Advent and are drawing closer to the light of Christ coming into the world at Christmas.

As I've mentioned before, the Advent season is pretty short this year, so we have one more parish event to help focus our hearts on Jesus' coming. Our annual Christmas Concert, called the Infancy Narrative, will take place on Wednesday, Dec. 20th at 7:00pm in church. At this free concert, our parish choir will sing beloved Christmas carols, interspersed with readings of the Gospel stories of Jesus' birth. Take a break from the busyness of this week and come listen to the stories and music that remind us of the reason for the season.

Next weekend, we will be on the verge of Christmas, so allow me to again explain how our Mass schedule will work for the Fourth Sunday of Advent, Christmas Eve, and Christmas Day. The Fourth Sunday of Advent falls on Dec. 24th this year, which means that the Christmas season will begin shortly after the Masses for the Fourth Sunday. Please remember that there will be two separate Mass obligations between Dec. 23-25: attending a Fourth Sunday of Advent Mass, and attending a Christmas Mass. This is what the Mass schedule will be for Dec. 23-25:

For the Fourth Sunday of Advent, we will have our normal weekend Mass schedule: 4:30pm on Dec. 23rd, and 9:30am & 11:30am on Dec. 24th.

For Christmas, we will have two Christmas Eve Masses on Dec. 24th: 4:00pm and Midnight. On Christmas Day, Dec. 25th, we will have two Masses: 9:30am & 11:30am.

To clarify: there will be four Masses on Sunday, Dec. 24th, but the two morning ones will be for the Fourth Sunday of Advent, and the afternoon and evening Masses will be for Christmas. Again, the obligation for Catholics is to attend <u>one</u> Mass for the Fourth Sunday of Advent (on either Dec. 23 or 24), and <u>one</u> Mass for Christmas (on either Dec. 24 or Dec. 25). So, in other words, **attending only one Mass on Sunday, Dec. 24**th **does** <u>not</u> **fulfill both Mass obligations.**

Finally, don't forget that our 2024 HYPOD raffle tickets are now available. HYPOD tickets are \$10 each. You can purchase them at the rectory, and they are also available in the pamphlet rack at the back of church (they are green tickets). And while HYPOD tickets can be purchased anytime throughout the year, the best time to get them is now! That is because every ticket that you buy is valid for <u>every</u> weekly drawing of the year (because even if your ticket wins, it goes back into the pot for the next week's drawing). The weekly prize is either \$100 or \$500. It is possible to win more than once with one ticket. The first drawings for 2024 will begin in January, so any 2024 ticket that you buy before then will be valid for all 52 drawings of the year.

An estimated 40 million Americans are coping with some form of anxiety and 70 percent of Americans say the coronavirus outbreak is a new source of stress in their lives.

Mental Health First Aid is an internationally recognized course that will teach participants how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental illness and substance use disorders. This training is being offered free of charge as part of Ascension Illinois Community Benefit.


