From the Pastor's Desk

As I mentioned last weekend from the pulpit, this weekend we begin the 2025 Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA). This is the first of three consecutive weekends that I will be promoting the ACA during Mass. Feb. 15-16 is the Announcement Weekend; Feb. 22-23 is the Commitment Weekend (when we offer an in-pew pledge process); and March 1-2 is the Follow-Up Weekend. I ask for your patience as I take time to explain the significance of the ACA for the Chicago Archdiocese, as well as for HVM Parish. Incidentally, you may have noticed that the ACA is starting a little later than usual. This is because the promotion weekends of the ACA are always scheduled for the three weekends leading up to Ash Wednesday, and Ash Wednesday happens to be a little later this year (March 5th).

The theme of this year's ACA is "Together We Bring Hope". This builds off the theme of last year's ACA, which was "Together At The Table." Obviously, the common denominator here is the notion of "together," reminding us that we all share the same mission of building up God's Kingdom on earth. In addition, this year's theme of "Together We Bring Hope" also builds on the theme of the 2025 Jubilee Year that was announced by Pope Francis (which I spoke about last month). The Jubilee Year theme is "Pilgrims of Hope." Obviously, the connection between these two themes is the importance of us living out the cardinal virtue of hope.

On this weekend, I am giving an introduction and overview of this year's ACA, and how it will support not only Archdiocesan ministries, but also our parish. Next weekend, Cardinal Cupich will speak about the ACA in a recorded talk at all our Masses.

I'm happy to say, for many consecutive years now, we have been very successful in the ACA, in that we have always collected funds beyond our goal. For example, our goal for the 2024 ACA was \$23,121. As of Jan. 21, 2025, we have received \$41,767 in pledges, and we've collected \$41,102 – and I must note that it is amazing that we have collected almost 100% of our pledges, because that is not common in any campaign! And because we surpassed our goal, this means that HVM Parish will receive a rebate of over \$18,000 to be used for our needs.

Our goal for this year's ACA is \$23,557, and I'm hopeful that we'll be able to not only reach it, but also surpass it, thanks to your generosity.



A Note From The Parish Nurse...

Greetings from the Parish Nurse...

February is American Heart Month. This may be the perfect opportunity to check in with your doctor if you are due for a visit, to learn more about your numbers, (for example your cholesterol level and your blood pressure readings), so you know if you need to make some lifestyle changes. A heart healthy diet partly consists of eating a variety of fruits and vegetables, choosing whole grains, and including healthy protein sources every day, along with lowering salt and sugar intake. Fueling your body with a variety of healthy foods and drinking some water for hydration should help your body and improve your energy and activity levels.

February is also Cancer Prevention Month and the same principals for heart health also can apply to help cancer prevention. Becoming physically active is also recommended for overall health and well-being. Any kind of movement is better than none and it is best to start off slow and move gently to avoid injury when beginning new activities. Of course getting medical clearance from your doctor is important for any medical concerns with increased activity or before starting a new exercise program.

Sleep also plays a big role in the amount of energy you have for dedication to exercise and activities during the day. Most adults need 7-9 hours of sleep each night which can also be a challenge for some. Sleep benefits the repair of cells and tissues in the body, helps to provide a stronger immune system, improves mood and energy, helps with better brain function, and decreases risk of chronic diseases. To improve your sleep, you may want to put away your electronic devices and experiment with relaxing activities that interest you as you begin to wind down your day, such as reading or listening to calming music or drinking a warm caffeine-free beverage before bed.

So let us take time in the new year to prioritize our health. We just may realize that we have developed lifelong healthy habits, a gift to ourselves that keeps on giving!


